I. IDCMR Background

In order to develop the oral health resource capacity among the Mekong River Region countries, the International Dental Collaboration of the Mekong River Region, or IDCMR, was created. Dental education institutes in Cambodia, PR China, Laos PDR, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam joined as members.

IDCMR was established at the First Congress, 7 to 8 June 2007 in Bangkok under the theme "Practical Points in Dentistry: The Alternatives." Subsequently, the IDCMR Secretariat Office at the Faculty of Dentistry, Mahidol University was assigned by IDCMR Executive Members.

The Second International Congress was held 4 to 5 April in Ho Chi Minh City under the theme, "Partnership for Innovative Practice in Dentistry" with 2006 and the third, "Everyone Will Enjoy Oral Health Care in Future" from 17 to 21 October in Kunming, China with a continually increasing number of participants.

In addition to the annual congress, a meeting to promote research collaboration was held 27 to 29 April in Chonburi, Thailand. The meeting was attended by 20 participants from Cambodia, Lao PDR, Hanoi, Ho Chi Minh and Thailand.

IV The Fourth IDCMR Congress Report

This report details the events of the Fourth IDCMR Congress, 18 to 21 November 2007 at the Amari Watergate Hotel, Bangkok, Thailand

a. Precongress Program – 18 November

The Precongress Program began with registration 8:30 am 18 November. The three morning lectures were "How to Control Inflammation in Periodontitis" and "Periodontally Accelerated Osteogenic Orthodontics" by Professor Thomas E Van Dyke and "Tendencies in Implant Treatment: Which Protocols Promise Long Term Success?" by Dr. Jan Kielhorn. In the afternoon, Dr. Jan Kielhorn conducted his workshop, "Bone and Soft Tissue Management: Piezosurgery and Microsurgery at Its Best."

A total of 134 participants attended the session.

b. IDCMR Executive Meeting

The IDCMR Executive Meeting commenced at noon with Deans and their Representatives from the Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Health Sciences, Cambodia, Professor Suon Phany and Professor Tuy Thel, the Faculty of Stomatology, Kunming Medical Science, China, Professor Xu Viao and Dr. He Hongbing, the Dean of the School of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy, Can Tho University, Vietnam, Dr. Le Thi Loi, the Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medical Sciences, Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, Dr. Ngo Thi Quynh Lan and Dr. Huynh Anh Lan, the National University of Odonto-Stomatology, Hanoi, Vietnam, Professor Tran Van Truong and the University of Health Sciences, Lao PDR., Dr. Aloungnadeth Sittiphanh, The Faculty of Dentistry, University of Indonesia, Dr. Angky Sokanto and the Faculty of Dentistry, Mahidol University, Thailand, Dr. M.L. Theerathavaj Srithavaj. A total of 26 representatives attended.

Assoc. Prof. Dr Theeralaksna Suddhasthira, Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry, Mahidol University, was appointed chair of the Executive Meeting and members discussed the agenda items covering: Annual Progress Reports by each member institution, and Future Projects. The main discussion points included determining that the National University of Odonto-Stomatology, Hanoi, Vietnam, will serve as the IDCMR Secretariat Office to host IDCMR 2008.

IDCMR future plans include collaboration in:

- short courses for undergraduate and post graduate student exchange
- post graduate studies
- joint research
- setting up priority areas of collaboration for 2008
- organizing a workshop on "Oral Health in the Mekong River Region in the 21st Century for 2008
- submitting joint projects to international agencies for funding

The Chair concluded the meeting at 4:40 pm.

c. Opening Ceremony

The Congress consisted of the Opening Ceremony, Events on the 19 through 21 November and Postcongress Program on 22 November

The first day of the international congress witnessed the Opening Ceremony started with a speech by HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn and the addresses of the President of Mahidol University, Professor Dr Pornchai Matangkasombut.

Assoc Prof Dr Theeralaksna Suddhasthira, Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry, Mahidol University announced the names of those members, distinguished guest speakers and sponsors selected to receive special plaques in recognition of their contributions to IDCMR 2007.

This was followed by a group photo and multimedia presentation on His Majesty King Rama the Ninth.

The Cocktail Social followed and ended at 9:30 pm. A total of 389 participants from over 17 countries attended.

d. Congress Program

i. Congress Program 19 November Events

November 19, the second day of the IDCMR Congress, showcased several plenary sessions. The Opening Session was "Knowledge Management for Oral Health Promotion" by Professor Vicharn Panich from the Knowledge Management Institute in Thailand.

At 10 am the Trade Exhibition featuring over 30 invited dental health care promoters was officially opened along with poster presentation viewing.

A total of 38 poster presentations were set up adjacent to the main hall.

Plenary Lecture Two was conducted by Dr Philippe Guettier, an R & D Consultant for Maillefer Instruments on "Nonsurgical Endodontic Retreatment" from 13:30 to 15:00 pm.

Plenary Lecture Three was conducted by Dr Jan Kielhorn Germany on "Special Lecture in Implantology" from 15:30 to 16:30 pm.

The remainder of the afternoon was devoted to oral presentations. From 18:00 to 21:00 pm, the Welcome Reception was held featuring student performances from the many assembled dental institutions.

The IDCMR Research Award Program objective is to encourage and give recognition for outstanding research. Applicants must submit their research abstracts separately to be considered for recognition.

Applicants submit research in any field related to oral health, basic science, oral biology and dental biomaterials, including clinical and restorative treatment.

Poster Presentations for Undergraduates were awarded under the IDCMR Clinical Professor Jurai Nakapaksin Apprentice Researcher Awards – given in recognition of dental students for most innovative research poster presentation with a First Prize of 10,00 baht, Second Prize of 8000 baht and Third Prize of 5000 baht

The best Oral Presentations for Undergraduates was awarded the Dean's Award, given in recognition of the most innovative research oral presentation, a top prize of 10,000 baht.

Oral Presentations by Postgraduate students, oral health practitioners and dental researchers were awarded under the IDCMR Emeritus Professor Somsak Chuckpaiwong Best Research Award, given in recognition for most innovative research oral presentation with a First Prize of 20,000 baht, Second Prize of 15,000 baht and Third Prize of 10,000 baht.

That afternoon the participants were given a Bangkok City Tour to the Grand Palace and The Emerald Buddha Temple.

e. Postcongress Program – 22 November

Professor Gianluca Gambarini presented his lecture, "A Rationale Approach to NiTi Rotory Instrumentation" from 9:00 AM – 12.00 PM. In the afternoon, he conducted a workshop on "Canal Preparation Using NiTi Rotory Instrumentation, assisted by Assistant

Abstract:

Studies reveal worldwide high prevalence of inadequate endodontic treatment and an urgent need for retreatment. Failure to perform the shaping, cleaning and filling of all the canal anatomy and to eliminate intra-canal infection are the primary cause of endodontic failure.

These goals are difficult for initial treatment but even more problematic during retreatment procedure. New scientific information and technological advancements enhance predictability for successful endodontic retreatment.

This lecture will cover crown and post disassembly procedure, the use of Ultrasonic to remove post or broken instruments, the elimination of paste, carrier and gutta-percha, the perforation repair with MTA, the recovering of patency for final shaping, cleaning and filling.

Abstract

Nowadays, we are treating more adult patients. They often have periodontal defects, worn/abraded teeth, broken down restorations, missing teeth, uneven spacing, and other periodontal and restorative problems that compromise the results. In addition, patients' demands on aesthetics are constantly increasing in both anterior and posterior regions. Therefore, all these conditions and expectation of the patients have to be concerned before the treatments start.

This presentation will discuss the interdisciplinary cases in the adult patients with orthodontic, periodontal and restorative complications about how to establish the suitable sequence of treatment for the interdisciplinary patients. Orthodontic tooth positioning, crown lengthening before restorative procedures, direct composite restoration to correct improper space/shape of anterior teeth and some implant cases are examples of treatment mentioned in this presentation

Clinical Effectiveness

BART VAN MEERBEEK obtained his DDS degree in 1988 and his Ph.D. degree in 1993 at the Catholic University of Leuven in Belgium. He continued his research activity abroad during one year at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Texas and later also at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In 1995, he became Assistant Professor (Docent) at the Catholic University of Leuven and since then teaches Dental Materials Science. In 1998 and 2002, he was promoted respectively to Associate Professor (Hoofddocent) and Professor (Hoogleraar), and in 2005 to Full Professor (Gewoon Hoogleraar). His primary research interest involves studies related to the adhesion of restorative materials to tooth tissue. His research work has



been published in more than 250 national and international peer-reviewed journals and has been honoured with awards such as the triennial Robert Stock award for Biomedical Sciences in 1996, the Albert Joachim Award in 1997, the Award in Biomedical Sciences of the Research Council of the Catholic University of Leuven in 1998, the IADR Young Research Award in 2000, the SmithKline Beecham award in 2001 and the Buonocore Memorial Lecturer in 2003. Together with Prof. P. Lambrechts, he became in 2003 holder of the Toshio Nakao Chair for Adhesive Dentistry. He is currently President of the Pan-European-Federation of the International Association of Dental Research (IADR) and Treasurer of the Continental-European-Division of IADR. Since 2004, he is editor of the Journal of Adhesive Dentistry.

Abstract:

Dental adhesive technology is evolving fast. The extensive possibilities for 'direct' and 'invisible' restoration of teeth offer a definite answer to the primary request of our patients. The concurrent potential to limit sacrifice of sound tooth tissue has triggered a rapid turnover from a 'mechanical-oriented' to an 'adhesive' and 'minimal-invasive' tooth-care concept.

'How can I restore a decayed or fractured tooth least invasively?' should be the starting point of today's restorative dental practice. In each need of tooth restoration, this question should again be addressed.

The objective of this presentation is to illustrate this 'minimal-invasive' tooth-care concept with clinical examples, as well as to introduce the newest developments in adhesive technology required for it. Effectiveness of modern adhesives in laboratory will be correlated with clinical effectiveness data.

This lecture will be given from a sound critical standpoint en will encompass a broad amount of product-and-use information with direct application in the daily practice.
